They embrace universal concerns and are related to various aspects of life. The essence of myths and folklore lies in their sacred or religious associations as these involve magical, mysterious and supernatural elements. Various literary writers have revived an interest in myths and folklore through their creative expressions. Myths and folklores have therefore continued to imbue the imagination of creative artists resulting in a need to revisit them. The Seminar invites fresh approaches and critical observations to address their relevance in the present times. The following sub-themes may be considered as thrust areas for paper presentation:

- Myth and Religion
- Indigenous Myth, Folktales and Folklore
- Oral/Written Traditions
- Folklore, Legends and Fables
- Mythic Mis/representation of Gender/Sexuality in Literature
- Myth and Media
- Myth and Modernity
