INTRODUCTION

About the College

"Educate a man and you educate one person; educate a woman and you educate a whole nation."

- Mahatma Gandhi

It is with this motto that Maharani College embarked on its journey of providing opportunities for higher education to girls. The University Maharani College stands apart as an epitome of foresightedness of its founders, hard work of its staff and has paved the way for women's education in the feudal state of Rajasthan. The college has grown leaps and bounds ever since its inception. Established on 1st August 1944 with only 11 girls and 3 teachers in Madho Vilas under the patronage of the royal family especially Maharani Gayatri Devi, and called Intermediate College for Women, it has witnessed a meteoric rise and reached its present strength of more than 8000 students. Today it is Asia's largest multi faculty college.

The Founder Principal Smt. Savitri Bhartiya, instilled in the students and staff, a deep sense of responsibility and enthusiasm which continues even today. On 12th August 1947 it moved to its present premises and was rechristened 'Maharani College'. Maharani College became a part of the University as a constituent college in the year 1962.

The college stands as a testimonial to the visits of stalwarts like Dr Zakir Hussain, Dr S Radhakrishnan, Pt. Academic life here is oriented through offering undergraduate courses in Arts, science and Commerce streams. Besides the regular Pass course and Honors courses in all the three faculties, it also offers several innovative courses as SFS courses to prepare the students for their professional life. Technical courses such as, Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA), Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA), as well as add-on courses like IMB (Industrial Microbiology), Biotech (Biotechnology), Office Management and Secretarial Practice (OMSP) and Computer Application (C.A.) are also offered to meet challenges of current global scenario.

In a recent development, in 2023, Creche Facility has been developed covering an area of around 3 rooms to accommodate around 20 children at a time of young female faculties. A virtual studio has also been laid off in 2021 (Covid Period) to ensure proper recording and online display of lectures for students.

The College has given utmost priority to the health of its students. They are encouraged to take timely food with adequate diet, maintain physical fitness and pro-environment pollution free campus. The institution believes in inculcating wellbeing practices besides academic growth and progress. In this process, the institution initiated for **HEALTH FIRST**, a strategic plan to enhance nutritional standards and personality development among the girls.

The nutritional cell was started to disseminate the information of nutritional products in day-to-day life. Students can learn about the utilization and consumption of products. Regular interaction with the experts who came to deliver, discuss and share their experience with us can improve the knowledge of students on basic nutrition needed to nourish human body. This initiative helps individuals who cooks food to make it more delicious and healthier.

The institution handles the adolescent girls who are in their transformative age, i.e., 18-21 years old. Teenage girls may face depression, anxiety, eating disorders and other issues which may affect their studies, health and finally their personality. Keeping these issues in mind, the college began a Psychological Counseling Cell in the campus. Psychologists will address the students' issues by regular counseling and discussions. The cell succeeded in bringing positive behavioral changes among the students, ability in decision making, estimate their strengths and weakness and deal effectively when they encountered issues in their daily life.

In addition, Free Medical Camp was conducted to

checkup the regular health status of the students.
